2 Attachment 3.g. - FURTHER ORDERS

3
4 The court, having heard the evidence and considered the matter, and good cause appearing therefor,
5 makes the following findings and orders:

6 1. The following property is confirmed to Petitioner as her sole and separate property:

- 7 a. The real property located at 2031-B Lost Oak, Los Osos, California, having been
8 acquired before the date of marriage of the parties.
9 b. The business known as "Keep it Hidden Frames" having been acquired after the date
10 of marriage of the parties.
11 c. All personal property in Petitioner's possession acquired prior to the date of marriage.
12 d. Bank accounts opened by Petitioner after the parties' date of separation with
13 Petitioner's separate property funds.

14 2. The following community property is awarded to Petitioner as her sole and separate property
15 free and clear of any claim by Respondent:

- 16 a. The time-share known as Ridge Sierra, 265 Quaking Aspen, Lake Tahoe, Nevada.
17 The court finds the value of the time-share is \$4,500 and the encumbrance against the
18 time-share is \$1,388. Petitioner is ordered to pay the encumbrance and hold
19 Respondent harmless therefrom.
20 b. Mid-State Bank account number 2020809022 valued at \$5,018.
21 c. 1984 and 1987 VW Vanagons, total value \$5,000.
22 d. The patent filed with the United States Patent Office described as "concealed
23 compartment in picture frame" listed as number 5247744 at a value of \$3,000.
24 e. Community property furniture and furnishings in Petitioner's possession.

25 3. The following community property debts are assigned to Petitioner as her sole and separate
26 obligations and she shall hold Respondent harmless therefrom:

- 1 a. The debt due for the purchase of the time-share at Ridge Sierra, Lake Tahoe, Nevada,
2 referred to hereinabove.
- 3 b. The debt due Gerard Fisher in the amount of \$14,500.
- 4 4. Petitioner shall receive a credit for the payment of community debts with her separate funds
5 after the parties' date of separation as follows:
- 6 a. Ridge Sierra, Lake Tahoe, Nevada, time-share payments in the amount of \$5,712.
7 b. Gerard Fisher, payments of \$837.
8 c. Patent renewal of \$745.
- 9 5. The court finds that the parties' owned the business known as "L&M Craft" and operated the
10 business for less than a year after their date of separation. The court finds that the assets of L&M Craft have
11 been equally divided between the parties and each party is awarded those assets in his/her possession. The
12 court finds that the debts owed by L&M Craft were paid with sale proceeds and funds belonging to the
13 business. The debts of the business have been paid and there are no remaining funds to be distributed to the
14 parties.
- 15 6. The following property is awarded to Respondent as his sole and separate property:
- 16 a. Furniture, furnishings and other personal property in Respondent's possession which
17 the court finds is equal in value to those in Petitioner's possession.
18 b. The L&M Craft assets in Respondent's possession.
- 19 7. Respondent is awarded the following community debt and is ordered to hold Petitioner
20 harmless therefrom and to defend her against any liability thereon:
- 21 a. The debt due AAA MasterCard. The court finds the community portion of the debt
22 is \$5,300 and that there is additional debt owed on the card incurred by Respondent
23 after the parties' date of separation.
- 24 8. The court issues the following permanent restraining orders:
- 25 a. Respondent is ordered to stay at least twenty-five (25) yards away from Petitioner,
26 her place of work and her residence.
27 b. Respondent shall not harass, annoy or otherwise disturb the peace of Petitioner and
28 shall not contact her or telephone her.


1 9. The parties were married six years and four months. The court finds that the marriage was
2 not a long-term marriage. Petitioner has waived her right to receive spousal support from Respondent. The
3 court finds that each party is self-supporting. Accordingly, the court retains no jurisdiction to award spousal
4 support payable from either party to the other and terminates each party's right to receive spousal support
5 from the other.

6 10. Each party shall pay their own attorney's fees and costs.


