

Judgment

CAME ON for trial the foregoing matter. Based upon the Memorandum Decision and the Supplemental Decision entered in this cause, the court enters judgment declaring that the obligation to pay the attorneys' fees of Mary Skaja directly to the law firm of Casseb & Pearl as set forth in the Decree of

Divorce in Cause No. 2000-CI-00417, *In the Matter of the Marriage of Joseph J. Skaja and Mary C. Skaja*, in the 288th Judicial District Court, Bexar County, Texas, is adjudged non-dischargeable, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 523(a)(5). Further, the obligation to pay spousal support in the amount of \$2,500, as set out in the said Decree of Divorce, is adjudged non-dischargeable, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 523(a)(5). Further, the obligation to assist Mary C. Skaja in obtaining the transfer of such assets to her as awarded and specified in the said Decree of Divorce, is adjudged non-dischargeable. Further, the obligation to pay to Mary C. Skaja the amount of \$23,000, as set forth in the said Decree of Divorce, is adjudged dischargeable (and so discharged by operation of 11 U.S.C. §§ 727, 524). Further, the obligation to indemnify Mary C. Skaja for federal taxes owed by Joseph and Mary Skaja prior to the entry of the Decree of Divorce, as set out in the said Decree of Divorce, is adjudged dischargeable (and so discharged by operation of 11 U.S.C. §§ 727, 524).

All costs of court are to be borne by the parties incurring same.

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
