I, Francis JAMET, hereby declare that:

1. I am an officer/agent of France Telecom, with its principal place of business located at 6, place d'Alleray, 75015 Paris, France, authorized to execute this Declaration.

2. France Telecom is the owner of all rights in the U.S. Patent No. 5,581,550 by virtue of the Assignment executed by Pierre Boyer (executed on July 7, 1994), Jacqueline Boyer (executed on July 8, 1994), and Michel Servei (executed on July 7, 1994). The Assignment was recorded with the United States Patent and Trademark Office on August 29, 1994, under reel 7139 and frame 0291.

3. It has been brought to my attention that a Confirmatory License, executed January 5, 1995, from Hughes Missile Systems Company to United States of America, Secretary of the Navy, was recorded against U.S. Patent No. 5,581,550, on October 16, 1997, at reel 008787, and frame 0085.

4. France Telecom has not assigned, licensed, or transferred any of its rights in U.S. 5,581,550 to Hughes Missile Systems Company.

5. I believe that the Confirmatory License from Hughes Missile Systems Company to United States of America, Secretary of the Navy, was erroneously recorded against U.S. Patent No. 5,581,550.

6. France Telecom has been, and continues to be, the correct owner of all rights in U.S. Patent No. 5,581,550.

7. I further declare that all statements made herein of my own knowledge are true and that all statements made on information and belief are believed to be true; and further, that these statements were made with the knowledge that willful false statements and the like are punishable by fine and imprisonment, or both, under section 1001 of Title 18 of the United States Code and that such willful false statements may jeopardize the validity of the application of any patent issuing therefrom.
