ASSIGNMENT

WHEREAS Peter H. St. George-Hyslop, Paul E. Fraser and Johanna M. Rommens, citizens of Canada and U.K., Canada, and Canada, respectively, residing at 210 Richview Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, Canada M2P 3G3; 611 Windermere Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, Canada M6S 3L9; and 105 McCaul Street, Toronto, Ontario, Canada M5T 2K4, respectively, have invented certain new and useful improvements in GENETIC SEQUENCES AND PROTEINS RELATED TO ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE (hereafter "the Invention"), as fully set forth and described in U.S. Patent Applications No. 08/431,048; 08/495,641; 08/509,359 and _____ filed under the above title on April 28, 1993; June 28, 1993; July 31, 1993 and January 26, 1994 respectively and related international applications under the above title;

AND WHEREAS Peter H. St. George-Hyslop and Paul E. Fraser are employed by The Governing Council of the University of Toronto with a principal address of Room 106, Sweeney Hall, 27 King's College Circle, Toronto, Ontario M5S 1A1, (hereafter "the University"), and are governed by the Inventions Policy of the University;

AND WHEREAS Peter H. St. George-Hyslop and Paul E. Fraser wish to assign any and all rights which they may have in the Invention pursuant to that Inventions Policy to the University;

AND WHEREAS Johanna M. Rommens is employed by The Hospital for Sick Children, 555 University Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, M5G 1X8, (hereafter "the Hospital") and is governed by the Technology Transfer Policy of the Hospital;

AND WHEREAS the Hospital is the beneficial owner, pursuant to that Technology Transfer Policy, of the rights in the invention of Johanna M. Rommens who, in consideration of her employment by the Hospital and other good and valuable consideration, confirms assignment of her rights in the Invention to the Hospital;

AND WHEREAS the Hospital wishes to assign all its rights in and to the invention to HSC Research and Development Limited Partnership, having a place of business at 555 University Avenue, Suite S270, Toronto, Ontario, M5G 1X8;

AND WHEREAS it was the understanding of The University and of HSC Research and Development Limited Partnership, prior to commencement of the collaboration of the inventors which resulted in the Invention, that the University and HSC Research and Development Limited Partnership would jointly own any invention arising from said collaboration;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Johanna M. Rommens, confirm that, pursuant to that Technology Transfer Policy and for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, I did assign, transfer and set over and do hereby assign, transfer and set over to the Hospital, its successors and assigns, all my right, title and interest in and to the invention, and any and all patent applications and Letters Patent which may be made, granted or issued for the Invention in Canada and throughout the world, including the United States of

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Attention and including International Applications under the Patent Cooperation Treaty and including all divisions, continuations, revisions and extensions of any of the foregoing, and all international priority rights associated therewith, all to be held and enjoyed as fully and completely as the same might have been held by me had this assignment not been made; and

NOW THEREFORE The Hospital for Sick Children confirms that, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, it did assign, transfer and set over and does hereby assign, transfer and set over to HSC Research and Development Limited Partnership (hereinafter "the Assignee"), its successors and assigns, all its right, title and interest in and to the Invention, and any and all patent applications and Letters Patent which may be made, granted or issued for Invention in Canada and throughout the world, including the United States of America and including International Applications under the Patent Cooperation Treaty and including all divisions, continuations, revisions and extensions of any of the foregoing, and all international priority rights associated therewith, all to be held and enjoyed as fully and completely as the same might have been held by it had this assignment not been made;

AND Johanna M. Rommens and The Hospital for Sick Children further agree that they will promptly, upon request and without further compensation, do all lawful acts including the execution of all necessary documents, and the giving of testimony that in the opinion of the Assignee, its successors and assigns, may be necessary or desirable for obtaining, sustaining, or renewing Canadian and foreign Letters Patent relating to the foregoing assigned rights, and for perfecting, affording, recording and maintaining the title therein of the Assignee, its successors and assigns, and will generally cooperate to the fullest extent in all matters pertaining to said Invention and patents, and said Assignee's title therein.
