AMENDED
ORDER AUTHORIZING TRUSTEE TO SELL PROPERTY FREE AND CLEAR OF LIENS
TO SATISFY LIENS, AND TO TRANSFER LIENS TO THE NET PROCEEDS OF SALE

Whereas, after Notice and a Hearing on the Trustee's Motion to Sell Property Free and Clear of Liens and for Order Setting Procedure for Making Higher and Better Offers dated April 30, 2004 (the "Motion"), and the time set forth for objections to the sale contained in the Trustee's Notice of Intent to Sell Additional Property at Auction and for Opportunity to Make Higher and Better Offers (Doc. Id. No. 102) having passed, and after Notice and a Hearing on the Trustee's Motion for an Amended Order Incorporating Additional Property Inadvertently Omitted from the Original Order, this Court finding that: (a) the Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1334; (b) notice of the Motion and the Hearing was sufficient under the circumstances; and (c) the Court having determined that the legal and factual basis set forth in the Motion and at the Hearing established just cause for the relief herein granted;

THE COURT HEREBY FINDS AND CONCLUDES THAT:

(hereinafter, the “Inventions”) and, in each case, all divisions, and continuations thereof, and all Letters Patent of the United States which may be granted thereon, and all rights to claim priority on the basis of such applications (if any), as well as all rights to claim priority on the basis of such applications, and all applications for Letters Patent which may hereafter be filed for such inventions in any foreign country and all Letters Patent which may be granted on such inventions in any foreign country, and all extensions, renewals, and reissues thereof;

All drawings, designs, sketches, blueprints, specifications, notes, photographs, test reports, memoranda, reports, etc., whether hard copy or electronic pertaining to such Inventions;

All trademarks relating to such Inventions;

All prototypes, models, samples, tools and molds for such Inventions; and

All contracts, agreements with consultants or employees who assigned intellectual properties pertaining to such Inventions to the Debtor (hereinafter referred to as the “Property”)

under the terms set forth in the Motion is in the best interest of the Debtor and its estate.

B. The Trustee is authorized, pursuant to sections 363(b) and 363(f) of the United States Bankruptcy Code 11 U.S.C. §§ 101-1330 (the “Bankruptcy Code”), and Rules 2002(a)(2) and 6004 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the “Bankruptcy Rules”), to sell the Property to Apollo Camera, LLC (the “Buyer”) for the sum of \$50,000.00 by credit bid, which sum was applied on or about July 28, 2004.

C. Sound business reasons exist for the Trustee to sell the Property to the Buyer.

D. The sale of the Property is in the best interest of the Debtor, its estate, and creditors. The terms of the proposed sale represent the highest and best offer for the Property, and the purchase price payable thereunder is fair and reasonable.

E. The proposed sale was negotiated between the Trustee and the Buyer in good faith, without collusion, and from arm’s length bargaining positions. The Buyer is not related to or affiliated with the Trustee or the Debtor and is a buyer in good faith of the Property under 363(m) of the Bankruptcy Code and, as such, is entitled to the protections afforded thereby, as of this date. If the Trustee consummates the sale of the Property, the reversal or modification on appeal of this Order shall not affect the validity of the proposed sale of the Property or the right, title and interest purportedly conveyed to the Buyer in connection with such sale.

F. Cause exists to lift the ten day stay of implementation of sale orders imposed by Bankruptcy Rule 6004(g), and to waive the requirement that the Trustee file an appraisal of the Property prior to the sale under Local Rule 6004-1(b), it is

ORDERED that at the closing, the Property shall be sold, conveyed, assigned, transferred,

and delivered to the Buyer free and clear of all liens, mortgages, pledges, security interests, restrictions, prior assignments, liabilities, obligations, encumbrances, charges, claims, and interests of any and every kind, nature, and description whatsoever, including, without limitation, claims arising out of pending litigation, unpaid taxes, and the liens of any and all creditors of the Debtor on the Property, including without limitation those set forth below:

1. UCC Financing Statement in favor of Fog City Fund LLC recorded on April 16, 2001 with the Office of the Secretary of the State of Nevada as Document Number 0105400 as to Patent No. 6,162,194, Patent Application No. 9/259,999 and Patent 6,290,575 *only*;
2. UCC Financing Statement in favor of Apollo Camera, L.L.C. recorded September 9, 2002 with the Office of the Secretary of the State of Nevada as Document No. 2002023890;
3. UCC Financing Statement in favor of Mark LoGuidice dated January 13, 2003 and recorded on January 16, 2003 with the Office of the Secretary of the State of Nevada as Document No. 2003001749 (Mark LoGuidice is an “insider” as defined by 11 U.S.C. Section 101(31) who perfected his financing statement and Security Agreement referenced in the paragraph below within one year of December 31, 2003, the date the Debtor filed this bankruptcy; however, Mr. LoGuidice extended, according to documents supplied by the Debtor, the sum of \$3,253,000 after the liens were perfected);
4. Memorandum of Security Agreement between the Debtor and Mark LoGuidice dated and recorded February 3, 2003 with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office as Document 700023591A;

5. UCC Financing Statement in favor of Mark LoGuidice recorded April 28, 2003 with the Office of the Secretary of the State of Nevada as Document No. 2003011574; and a
6. UCC Financing Statement in favor of Apollo Camera, L.L.C. recorded May 2, 2003 with the Office of the Secretary of the State of Nevada as Document No. 2003012190 and it is further

ORDERED that this Court hereafter shall and does retain jurisdiction (a) to enforce and implement the terms and provisions of the sale approved by this Order and any asset purchase agreement related thereto, all amendments thereto, any waivers and consents thereunder, and of each of the agreements executed in connection therewith, (b) to compel delivery of the Property to the Buyer, (c) to compel delivery and payment of the consideration and any other amount due or owing to the Debtor pursuant to the terms of the proposed sale and under any asset purchase agreement relating thereto to the extent by, and in accordance with, the terms thereof, (d) to resolve any disputes, controversies, or claims arising out of, or relating to, the sale of the Property, and (e) to interpret, implement, and enforce the provisions of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that the Trustee's execution and delivery of the Agreement and the performance of the estate's obligations thereunder and the conveyances made pursuant thereto shall be, and hereby are, approved; and it is further

ORDERED that the Trustee is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all additional documents and papers and to take such other actions as may be reasonably necessary or appropriate to perform the estate's obligations under the Agreement and this Order, provided, however, that such additional or supplemental agreements and actions do not materially alter the terms of the transaction contemplated by the Agreement and this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that the Trustee is hereby authorized to take such action as may be necessary to implement the provisions of the Agreement and to execute and file any necessary documents and papers with any appropriate secretary of state or other governmental official or department, and this Order shall constitute all approvals and consents required by the laws of any state necessary to file, record, and accept such documents and papers to give effect thereto; and it is further

ORDERED that the failure specifically to include in this Order any particular provisions of an asset purchase agreement relating to the sale proposed in the Motion shall not diminish or impair the efficacy of such provisions, it being the intent of the Court that the sale as approved herein, and any asset purchase agreement relating thereto, be approved in its entirety unless otherwise ordered by this Court; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order shall serve as notice that each and every federal, state, and local governmental agency or department or official thereof may accept any and all documents, instruments, and papers necessary and appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by the Agreement; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order shall govern the acts of all persons and entities, including, without limitation, all filing agents, filing officers, title agents, title companies, recorders of mortgages, recorders of deeds, administrative agencies, governmental departments, secretaries of state, federal and local officials, and all other persons and entities who may be required by operation of law, the duties of their office, or contract, to accept, record, file, or register any instrument, document or paper, or report or insure any title or state of title in or to the Property; and it is further

ORDERED that the Buyer shall be entitled to the full protection of section 363(m) of the Bankruptcy Code with respect to the transaction contemplated hereby in the event that all or part of this Order is reversed, modified, or vacated on appeal or otherwise; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order shall be immediately effective upon its entry by the Court; and it is further

ORDERED that the stay on implementation of orders imposed pursuant to Bankruptcy Rule 6004(g) is hereby lifted and the parties are authorized to close the proposed sale transactions at any time after entry of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED THAT the Trustee need not file an appraisal of the Property before the sale under Local Rule 6004-1(b); and it is further

ORDERED that this Order is a final Order and there is no just reason for the delay of the entry of this Order.
