The Health Protection Agency Property Transfer Scheme 2013

The Secretary of State for Health makes this Property Transfer Scheme in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 300(1) and (2) and 301(1), (3) and (4) of, and Schedule 22 to, the Health and Social Care Act 2012(a).

Citation, commencement and application

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Health Protection Agency Property Transfer Scheme 2013 and comes into effect on 1st April 2013.

(2) The Scheme is made in connection with the abolition of the Health Protection Agency(b).

(3) This Scheme does not transfer any rights or liabilities under or in connection with a contract of employment.

Interpretation

2. In this Scheme—

“the Agency” means the Health Protection Agency(c);

“the Secretary of State” means the Secretary of State for Health;

“the transfer date” means 1st April 2013.

Transfer of property and related rights and liabilities

3.—(1) Any property held by the Agency immediately before the transfer date is to transfer, on the transfer date, to the Secretary of State.

(2) All rights relating to property held by the Agency immediately before the transfer date and which were enforceable by or against the Agency immediately before the transfer date are, on and after that date, to be enforceable by or against the Secretary of State.

(3) All liabilities of the Agency relating to property held by the Agency immediately before the transfer date are to transfer, on the transfer date, to the Secretary of State.

Transfer of other rights and liabilities

4. Any rights or liabilities (other than criminal liabilities(d)) not mentioned in paragraph 3 which the Agency has immediately before the transfer date are, on that date, to transfer to the Secretary of State.

(a) 2012 c.7.

(b) The Health Protection Agency (“the Agency”) was established by Health Protection Agency Act 2004 (c.17) and is abolished by section 56 of the Health and Social Care Act 2012 (“the 2012 Act”).

(c) The Agency is identified as a transferee in the first column of the Table in Schedule 22 to the 2012 Act (property transfer scheme) and in the first column of the Table in Schedule 23 to the 2012 Act (asset transfer scheme).

(d) Criminal liabilities may not be transferred to a Member of the House by a property transfer scheme under the 2012 Act (see section 20(1)(4) and (2) of the 2012 Act).

Continuity and supplementary provision

3.—(1) Any act or omission by or in relation to the Agency before the transfer date in connection with—

- (a) any property, rights or liabilities transferred under this Scheme; or
- (b) any contract or agreement entered into by the Agency in connection with any property, rights or liabilities transferred under this Scheme

is deemed to have been an act or omission of, or in relation to, the Secretary of State.

(2) Anything (which may include legal proceedings) which, when this Scheme takes effect, is in the process of being done by, or in relation to, the Agency in connection with any property, rights or liabilities transferred under this Scheme, is deemed to have effect as if done by, or in relation to, the Secretary of State, and may be confirmed by, or in relation to, the Secretary of State.

(3) Any reference to the Agency in any contract or agreement (whether written or not), instrument or other document in connection with any property, rights or liabilities transferred under this Scheme is to be treated as a reference to the Secretary of State.

(4) Where the rights and liabilities under a contract or agreement entered into or agreed by the Agency are transferred under this Scheme, that contract or agreement is to continue to have effect on and after the transfer date as if it was originally entered into or agreed by the Secretary of State.

(5) Any rights or liabilities relating to a contract or agreement (whether written or not) transferred under this Scheme which were enforceable by or against the Agency immediately before the transfer date are, on and after the transfer date, to be enforceable against the Secretary of State.

(6) No right to terminate or vary a contract, agreement, arrangement or instrument is to operate or become exercisable, and no provision of any contract, agreement, arrangement or instrument is to operate or become exercisable or be contravened, by reason of the transfer of any property, rights or liabilities under this Scheme

(7) The transfers of any property, rights or liabilities under this Scheme are to be made—

- (a) irrespective of any requirement for consent that would otherwise apply (whether arising under any enactment, instrument, agreement or otherwise); and
- (b) whether or not they would otherwise be capable of being transferred.
