In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the terms of the Cooperation Treaties and the terms of the Assignments, the terms of the Cooperation Treaties shall supersede and govern.

Subject to the terms of the Cooperation Treaties, the Parties each hereby mutually covenant and agree to reasonably cooperate to enable each to enjoy to the fullest extent permitted under the Cooperation Treaties, the right, title and interest in and to said inventions or improvements. Such reasonable cooperation shall include execution of any and all continuation, continuation-in-part, divisional, extension, renewal, and substitute applications for said invention or improvements, and any necessary oath, affidavit or declaration relating thereto, and any application for the reissue, reexamination or extension of any Letters Patent that may be granted upon said application. The Parties further hereby mutually covenant and agree to cooperate in any proceedings or transactions involving such applications or patents, including the preparation and execution of preliminary statements, giving and producing evidence, and performing any and all other acts necessary to obtain said Letters Patent in the United States, and vest all rights therein hereby conveyed jointly in the Parties, each of their successors and assigns.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and assigns.

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same Agreement. The signatures from each counterpart may be combined with a copy of the Agreement to constitute the entire Agreement.
